Background

The #ReadyToListen project aims to build the skills and capacity of residential aged care service providers to better respond to and prevent the sexual assault of older women and other older people who experience sexual assault.

The project will deliver education and resources, including an aged care Leadership Course, supporting residential aged care service providers through the practical steps involved in creating change.

The #ReadyToListen project has been funded by the Department of Health and is being delivered by the [Older Person's Advocacy Network](#), in partnership with [Celebrate Ageing](#) and the [Older Women's Network, New South Wales](#). Project Coordinator [Dr Catherine Barrett](#), the Director of [Celebrate Ageing](#) and a long-term advocate for prevention of the sexual assault of older women.

The key aim of the Project Collective is to support the #ReadyToListen project to ensure it builds capacity and skills of aged care service providers to prevent sexual assault. A further aim is to assist in engaging aged care service providers in take up of the resources developed.
