Sexuality after stroke – Staff survey (SOX Survey)

#### **Survey Participant Information Sheet**

#### About the survey

This survey has 15 questions about your knowledge, confidence and level of comfort providing clients with information on changes to sexuality after stroke. By sexuality we mean: sex, gender identities and roles, sexual orientation, eroticism, pleasure and intimacy. This study has been approved by the Faculty of Health Science's Human Ethics Committee at Latrobe University (number FHEC11/27)

#### Confidentiality

This survey is anonymous, which means that any identifying information will not be matched with survey responses. Information such as email/IP addresses will not be kept or linked to your survey answers. A report on the survey results for your organisation will be provided to the project coordinator/s in your organisation. The data (without any identifying details) will be kept by La Trobe University. The survey results for your organisation will not be used in a way that can identify you.

#### How will my survey information be used?

The results of this survey will inform the implementation of the Sexuality After Stroke project in your organisation. The project coordinator/s in your organisation will utilise the survey results to develop a staff education program to build staff knowledge, skills and confidence relating to sexuality after stroke. The survey will be repeated in a year to identify whether any changes have occurred.

The results of the survey will be published in a report written by the project coordinator in your organisation and published by the ARCSHS and the Victorian Stroke Network. The purpose of the report is to assist other stroke services to learn from the project.

#### Your consent

Your decision whether or not to participate will not prejudice your future relations with ARCSHS, the Victorian Stroke Network or your organisation. If you decide to participate, you are free to withdraw your consent and to discontinue participation at any time during the survey.
